Earlier this year, members approved moving forward with a change in the timing of voting and installation of board members. Most of the Bylaws changes involve this.

In summary:

- we will ask for nominees beginning January, present nominees in March, vote in April, install May, and members begin their terms July 1 (we often do not have a formal meeting in June).
- The VP of Programs was added to Executive Board.
- Payment criteria for guild members making presentations at a meeting were clarified.
- Duties of Social Media Coordinator were clarified as well as Guild records management.

Once the bylaws are accepted by the vote in November, the final version will be included in the next newsletter and in the Guild membership directory.
