QUILT EXHIBIT PALM SPRINGS ART MUSEUM

The Palm Springs Art Museum will be exhibiting a new collection of 19 Day of the Dead quilts for the third year. We will send an eblast when we know the opening date of the installation.

All 19 quilters are members of the Coachella Valley Quilt Guild and have created quilts inspired by the "Just Add Color, Day of the Dead" coloring book. Artist Sarah Walsh graciously allowed us to use her illustrations as the basis for our quilts. We had little guidelines for this challenge other than to look at her illustrations and let your imagination go wild. The history, the colors, and the amazing imagery surrounding Dia de los Muertos evokes emotion and creativity in each of us who have participated. It is no wonder that this is the third series of quilts we have completed involving this same theme.

The art museum has free admission on Thursdays after 4 PM (same night as Village Fest) and on the 2nd Sunday of the month. Otherwise check their website for general hours and admission fees. We hope you get a chance to see this exhibit.
